

Sports Update

Padworth College Football Club had a busy half-term with two matches against Bradfield College. After weeks of training and with confidence high, the team accepted a challenge from Bradfield. The match started well with some great possession football being played. The Padworth team were able to hold on to and pass the ball around. Konrad, in the Padworth goal, made some excellent saves to keep the home team out and then Raiymbek capped off a fine Padworth move with a shot from 25 yards nestling nicely into the bottom corner. 1-0 Padworth.

The game was a battle of the midfields with Yousef dominating possession for Padworth College and orchestrating some lovely moves. Charlie, strong in the Padworth defence, quashed any of the opposing team's attacks. Padworth looked sharp and some crisp moves could have been rounded off to put the first half to bed. However, 40 minutes into the game the weather took a turn and the blue skies darkened leading to a near apocalyptic downpour which quickly flooded the pitch and introduced many of the Padworth team to hail stones. With the half time whistle being blown, the Padworth team took shelter from the storm, however the referee decided that the pitch was too wet to continue the game and the match was postponed.

With the weather much nicer, the repeat fixture started in a similar fashion with the Padworth boys playing some fantastic football. Unfortunately, Bradfield found the net first with a well-timed run from the striker to beat the back line and finish the move, beating the heroic Konrad at the far post. Dickson was able to drag the Padworth team back in to the match when he broke into the penalty area and finished with aplomb. Padworth nearly took the lead with another explosive run from Dickson which saw him brought down by the keeper and the referee award a penalty to Padworth. Dickson, as captain, stepped up to the mark but the keeper was equal to it and saved well. Bradfield were able to capitalise on the inexperience of the Padworth team and scored a few more to take home the victory, but the Padworth team left with their heads held high for what was a fantastic performance.

They can take pride in their performance as they worked together as a team and showed excellent character and resilience. The team continues to train every Thursday night and are hoping to build on their current

Meanwhile, on campus, we have enjoyed some fabulous pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, plus our very own Valentine's Day Party!


















### Availability for Summer Term, 2022/23 Academic Year
