This role includes oversight of the department's strategic direction, academic performance, and extracurricular opportunities, preparing students to thrive at university and beyond.

Leadership and Strategy:

- Develop and implement a dynamic, real-world-focused curriculum that engages students in critical thinking, practical application, and independent research.
- Lead the department in achieving and maintaining the highest standards of teaching and learning.

Teaching and Learning:

- Ensure teachers stay up to date with the latest developments in Business and Economics, bringing fresh insights into the classroom.

Facilities and Resources:

- Support the College to develop a 'Boardroom' classroom environment, featuring businessthemed décor and spaces for collaborative work.
- Integrate digital tools into the curriculum to enhance learning experiences and provide opportunities for virtual business simulations.

Other Responsibilities:

- Manage the department's budget, ensuring effective allocation of resources to support curriculum and extracurricular activities.
- Contribute to whole-school initiatives and priorities
- Maintain strong links with external organizations, including universities, local businesses, and professional associations.
- All teachers at Padworth are expected to Tutor. This involves taking registration, regular meetings with tutees, and delivering a weekly Virtue lesson.
- Hours of work: The teaching load is up to 21 hours per week, the College day has 8x45 minute lessons per day. Timetabled teaching is from Monday to Friday. The College day is 08:30-16:45 Monday to Friday. In addition, teachers are expected to do one evening per fortnight until 20:15 supporting prep and 2 Sundays per term.
